

**Minutes from the ACS COMP Executive Meetings**  
**San Diego, CA**  
**March 24, 2012**

**Programming Meeting**

- 1) Larger number of papers compared to normal: 631 abstracts: 480 talks, remainder is posters
- 2) Philadelphia: programming is established and all standard symposia are present
  - a. Abstract deadline is April 3
  - b. COMP should co-sponsor with SOCED for undergraduate poster session
  - c. For Philly and future, COMP will be a subdivision within undergrad session
  - d. We would like ACS to allow for the undergrads to give the poster in both the undergraduate section and COMP
- 3) At Philly can we do a session on Sunday afternoon for undergraduates where we cover an overview of programming by COMP, and also have a way for undergraduates to present 2min(2 slides) on their poster. This would be followed by lunch with members of COMP and the wider community.
  - a. Full first Sunday afternoon session
  - b. **ACTION ITEM:** Reach out to undergraduates to let them know it exists
    - i. Scott, Jane, Emilio, Jeffry, Jeff Evanseck
    - ii. Letter is informative about content
    - iii. Also invites them to give a 2 min presentation on poster
    - iv. Will consider providing ARCC to all those who participate
    - v. Will consider providing an award for best poster
- 4) Scott put together a list of all undergraduates with COMP related content, this list will be sent around to the Exec so that we can attend the poster sessions and discuss the posters with the presenters
- 5) It was discussed again whether COMP needs to be more restrictive on abstract submissions
  - a. Is there a benefit to limiting the number of presentations per presenter/organization
  - b. Suggestion was made to table the discussion until Emilio is around
    - i. Possibly discuss at Philadelphia 2012

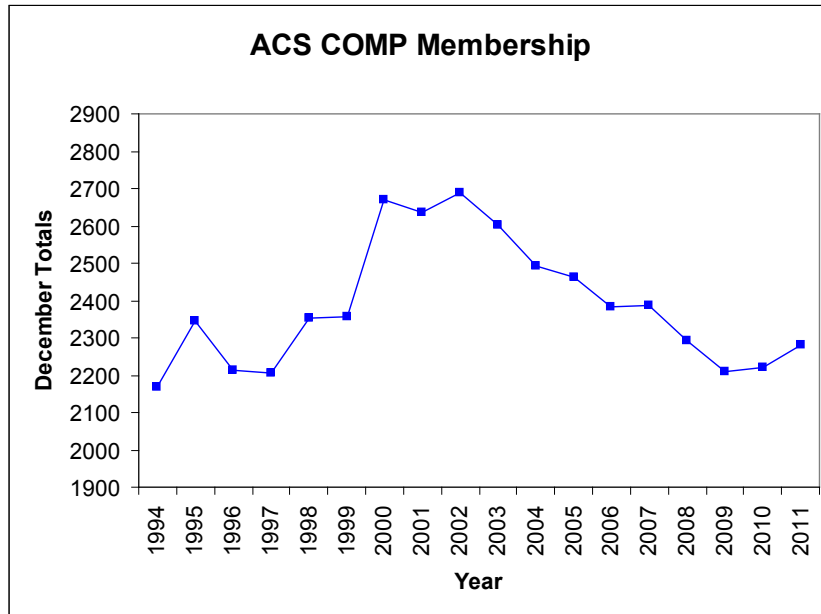

- 4) DOI and ISI are important considerations for alternative publishing
- 5) a journal would be able to do color for articles
- 6) ARCC - 0.72 impact factor for 2009
